



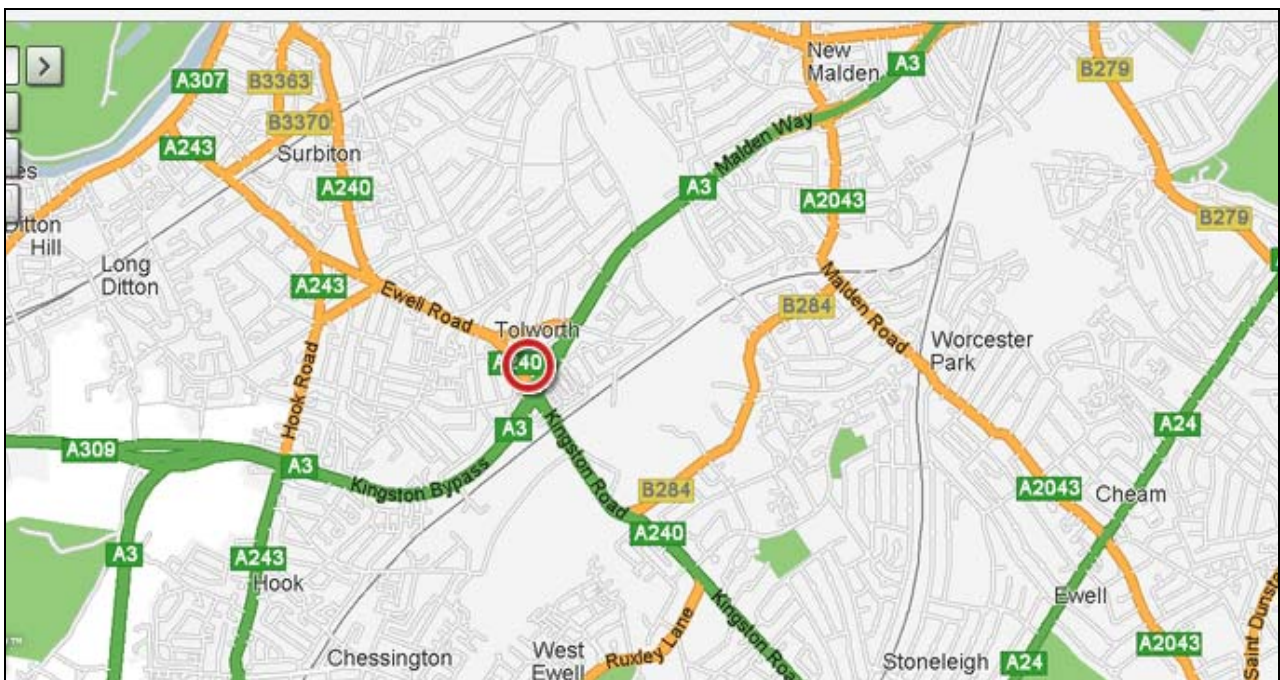
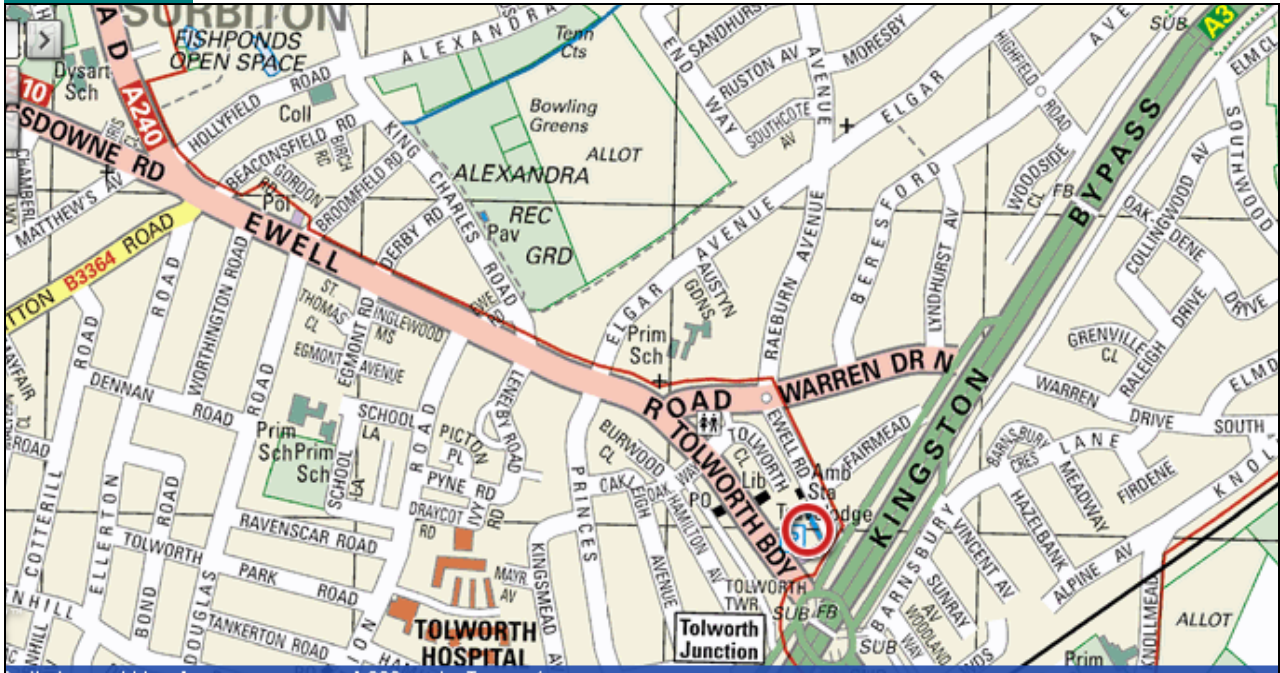

Directions

By Train

There is a train service which runs from London Waterloo to Tolworth Station which is directly opposite Tolworth Tower.

Upon exiting Surbiton the easiest way to get to Tolworth Tower is by getting a taxi or one of the many buses to Tolworth. You will see the building as you approach and the taxi driver should drop you outside the entrance. On the buses front just ring the bell and exit at the Bus stop that is nearest to the Tower. Walk around the building from the Marks and Spencer's side to the main entrance and then enter Tolworth Tower. Security will then direct you to the correct floor.

By Car

From the North or South:

If your coming from North or South you'd use the A3, exit at Tolworth Junction, round the roundabout until your on the slip road of the A3 again (heading North) but don't actually go on the A3, turn off at the Marks & Spencer's slip road instead and use their car park.

From the East:

If you are coming in from the Epsom/Wallington direction. Then the best bet is to take the A240 (Kingston Road). This runs directly up to Tolworth roundabout (as it intersects the A3) and on through Surbiton and Kingston on the other side. You can then enter the Marks & Spencer's car park to gain access to the building.

From the West:

If your coming from the West from the Surbiton/Kingston direction you will be coming along the Ewell Road you will see Tolworth Tower with the main entrance to the Marks and Spencer's car park on your left.

If you park in the Marks and Spencer's car park for longer than three hours a flat fee is levied. Please bear this in mind when visiting Tolworth.

Important Information about this Venue

HMRC Tolworth Tower does NOT fully comply with the access requirements of the Equality Act 2010.

This is due to the fact the conference room is on the 20th floor and this would make an evacuation in the case of an emergency extremely difficult.
