GP	Gross Pay for NI purposes
w/m	Number of weeks or months in tax year i.e. 52 weeks or 12 months.
p	Number of weeks/months in Pay Period. Round result of calculation at this point up to nearest whole pound.
p ¹	Number of weeks/months in Pay Period. If equals 1 round result of calculation at this point to the nearest whole pound. If equals more than 1 round UP to whole pounds.

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 Following an announcement by the Chancellor of the Exchequer in his pre Budget Report on 5 December 2005 the NI rates and earnings limits which take effect from 6 April 2006 are reflected in this supplement to the NI Guidance for Software Developers 2003+.

1.2 Details of these changes can also be found in the HM Revenue & Customs (HMRC) Notes for Payroll Software Developers series 10 issue 27. This supplement also contains worked examples which have been updated using the new NI rates and earnings limits for 2006/2007.

1.3 Temporary NI Numbers

Temporary NI numbers consisting of a TN prefix followed by a date of birth and an M or F suffix are no longer acceptable from the 2004/2005 tax year. If the NI number is not known the gender and date of birth details should be completed on any data submissions to HMRC. In exceptional cases where the date of birth is not known the date should be completed as 01011901.

For further information on NI number formats for PAYE forms refer to Paragraph 2.5 of the IR Notes for Payroll Software Developers Series 10 No.16 issued December 2003 and also Notes Series 10 No.19.1 Paragraph 2.6 issued July 2004, which contains an amendment in relation to form P38A.

3. WORKED EXAMPLES USING THE NIC CALCULATION FORMULAE

EXAMPLE 1

An Employee earns £86.53 a week and pays standard not contracted-out NICs

Category A NICs

Step 1. Earnings up to and including LEL

$$\left(GP - \left(\frac{LEL \times p}{w/m} \right)^* \right) =$$
$$\left(£86.53 - \left(\frac{£4,368 \times 1}{52} \right)^* \right) = £2.53 \text{ (enter weekly LEL (£84) in column 1a)}$$

If answer is negative no NICs due and no recording required. Stop.

If answer is zero or positive enter result of calculation at this point * in column 1a and proceed to Step 2.

Step 2. Earnings above LEL up to and including ET

$$\left(GP - \left(\frac{LEL \times p}{w/m} \right) \right) - \left(GP - \left(\frac{ET \times p^1}{w/m} \right) \right)^{\#} =$$
$$\left(£86.53 - \left(\frac{£4,368 \times 1}{52} \right) \right) - \left(£86.53 - \left(\frac{£5,035 \times 1}{52} \right) \right)^{\#} = £2.53 \text{ (enter in column 1b)}$$

If answer is negative treat as zero.

If answer is zero no NICs due and no recording required in column 1b.

Stop.

If answer is positive enter in column 1b and proceed to Step 3.

Step 3. Earnings above ET up to and including UEL

$$\left(GP - \left(\frac{ET \times p^1}{w/m} \right) \right) - \left(GP - \left(\frac{UEL \times p}{w/m} \right) \right)^{\#} =$$
$$\left(£86.53 - \left(\frac{£5,035 \times 1}{52} \right) \right) - \left(£86.53 - \left(\frac{£33,540 \times 1}{52} \right) \right)^{\#} = £0.00 \text{ (no NICs due - no recording in column 1c)}$$

If answer is negative treat as zero.

If answer is zero no NICs due and no recording required in column 1c.

Steps 4 to 11 are not applicable.

Although no NICs are due, as earnings have reached or exceeded the LEL, they must be recorded on the P11 as follows:

A	£84	£2.53	£0	£0	£0

EXAMPLE 2

An Employee earns £98.95 a week and pays standard not contracted-out NICs

Category A NICs

Step 1. Earnings up to and including LEL

$$\left(GP - \left(\frac{LEL \times p}{w/m} \right)^* \right) =$$
$$\left(£98.95 - \left(\frac{£4,368 \times 1}{52} \right)^* \right) = £14.95 \text{ (enter weekly LEL (£84) in column 1a)}$$

If answer is negative no NICs due and no recording required. Stop.

If answer is zero or positive enter result of calculation at this point * in column 1a and proceed to Step 2.

Step 2. Earnings above LEL up to and including ET

$$\left(GP - \left(\frac{LEL \times p}{w/m} \right) \right) - \left(GP - \left(\frac{ET \times p^1}{w/m} \right) \right)^{\#} =$$
$$\left(£98.95 - \left(\frac{£4,368 \times 1}{52} \right) \right) - \left(£98.95 - \left(\frac{£5,035 \times 1}{52} \right) \right)^{\#} = £13 \text{ (enter in column 1b)}$$

If answer is negative treat as zero.

If answer is zero no NICs due and no recording required in column 1b.

Stop.

If answer is positive enter in column 1b and proceed to Step 3.

Step 3. Earnings above ET up to and including UEL

$$\left(GP - \left(\frac{ET \times p^1}{w/m} \right) \right) - \left(GP - \left(\frac{UEL \times p^1}{w/m} \right) \right)^{\#} =$$
$$\left(£98.95 - \left(\frac{£5,035 \times 1}{52} \right) \right) - \left(£98.95 - \left(\frac{£33,540 \times 1}{52} \right) \right)^{\#} = £1.95 \text{ (enter in column 1c)}$$

If answer is negative treat as zero.

If answer is zero no NICs due and no recording required in column 1c.

If answer is positive enter in column 1c and proceed to Step 4.

Step 4. Earnings above UEL

$$\left(GP - \left(\frac{UEL \times p}{w/m} \right) \right) =$$
$$\left(£98.95 - \left(\frac{£33,540 \times 1}{52} \right) \right) = £0.00$$

If answer is zero or negative no earnings above UEL. Proceed to Step 5.
If answer is positive proceed to Step 5.

Step 5. Employee's NICs

Step 3 multiplied by employee's Band C % rate (round)

$$£1.95 \times 11\% = £0.214 = £0.21$$

PLUS

Step 4 multiplied by employee's Band D % rate (round)

$$£0.00 \times 1\% = £0.00$$

$$£0.21 + £0.00 = £0.21 \text{ Employee's NICs}$$

Step 6. Employer's NICs

Step 3 multiplied by employer's Band C % rate (round)

$$£1.95 \times 12.8\% = £0.2496 = £0.25$$

PLUS

Step 4 multiplied by employer's Band D % rate (round)

$$£0.00 \times 12.8\% = £0.00$$

$$£0.25 + £0.00 = £0.25 \text{ Employer's NICs}$$

Steps 7 and 8 = £0.00 (rebate not applicable)

Step 9. Employee's net NICs

Step 5 - £0.21

MINUS

Step 7 - £0.00

= £0.21 Employee's net NICs (if result is negative enter zero in column 1c and carry forward balance to Step 10).

Step 10. Employer's net NICs

Step 6 - £0.25

MINUS

Step 8 - £0.00 (include any minus figure from Step 9)

= £0.25 Employer's net NICs

Step 11. Total NICs

Step 9 - £0.21

PLUS

Step 10 - £0.25

= £0.46 Total employer and employee NICs (enter in column 1d)

NICs must be recorded on the P11 as follows:

	1a	1b	1c	1d	1e
A	£84	£13	£1.95	£0.46	£0.21

EXAMPLE 3

An Employee earns £102.50 a week and pays standard contracted-out NICs (COSR)

Category D NICs

Step 1. Earnings up to and including LEL

$$\left(GP - \left(\frac{LEL \times p}{w/m} \right)^* \right) =$$
$$\left(£102.50 - \left(\frac{£4,368 \times 1}{52} \right)^* \right) = £18.50 \text{ (enter weekly LEL (£84) in column 1a)}$$

If answer is negative no NICs due and no recording required. Stop.
If answer is zero or positive enter result of calculation at this point * in column 1a and proceed to Step 2.

Step 2. Earnings above LEL up to and including ET

$$\left(GP - \left(\frac{LEL \times p}{w/m} \right) \right) - \left(GP - \left(\frac{ET \times p}{w/m} \right) \right)^{\#} =$$
$$\left(£102.50 - \left(\frac{£4,368 \times 1}{52} \right) \right) - \left(£102.50 - \left(\frac{£5,035 \times 1}{52} \right) \right)^{\#} = £13 \text{ (enter in column 1b)}$$

[#] If answer is negative treat as zero.
If answer is zero no NICs due and no recording required in column 1b.
Stop.
If answer is positive enter in column 1b and proceed to Step 3.

Step 3. Earnings above ET up to and including UEL

$$\left(GP - \left(\frac{ET \times p}{w/m} \right) \right) - \left(GP - \left(\frac{UEL \times p}{w/m} \right) \right)^{\#} =$$
$$\left(£102.50 - \left(\frac{£5,035 \times 1}{52} \right) \right) - \left(£102.50 - \left(\frac{£33,540 \times 1}{52} \right) \right)^{\#} = £5.50 \text{ (enter in column 1c)}$$

[#] If answer is negative treat as zero.
If answer is zero no NICs due and no recording required in column 1c.
If answer is positive enter in column 1c and proceed to Step 4.

Step 4. Earnings above UEL

$$\left(GP - \left(\frac{UEL \times p}{w/m} \right) \right) =$$
$$\left(£102.50 - \left(\frac{£33,540 \times 1}{52} \right) \right) = £0.00$$

If answer is zero or negative no earnings above UEL. Proceed to Step 5.
If answer is positive proceed to Step 5.

Step 5. Employee's NICs

Step 3 multiplied by employee's Band C % rate (round)

$$£5.50 \times 9.4\% = £0.517 = £0.52$$

PLUS

Step 4 multiplied by employee's Band D % rate (round)

$$£0.00 \times 1\% = £0.00$$

$$£0.52 + £0.00 = £0.52 \text{ Employee's NICs}$$

Step 6. Employer's NICs

Step 3 multiplied by employer's Band C % rate (round)

$$£5.50 \times 9.3\% = £0.5115 = £0.51$$

PLUS

Step 4 multiplied by employer's Band D % rate (round)

$$£0.00 \times 12.8\% = £0.00$$

$$£0.51 + £0.00 = £0.51 \text{ Employer's NICs}$$

Steps 7 Employee's NIC rebate

Step 2 multiplied by Employee's Band B rate (round)

$$£13 \times 1.6\% = £0.208 = £0.21 \text{ Employee rebate}$$

Step 8. Employer's NIC rebate

Step 2 multiplied by employer's Band B rate (round)

$£13 \times 3.5\% = £0.455 = £0.45$ Employer rebate

Step 9. Employee's net NICs

Step 5 – £0.52

MINUS

Step 7 – £0.21

= £0.31 Employee's net NICs (if result is negative enter zero in column 1e and carry forward balance to Step 10).

Step 10. Employer's net NICs

Step 6 – £0.51

MINUS

Step 8 – £0.45

= £0.06 Employer's net NICs (include any minus figure from Step 9).

Step 11. Total NICs

Step 9 – £0.31

PLUS

Step 10 – £0.06

= £0.37 Total employer and employee NICs (enter in column 1d - this could be a minus figure which should be preceded by "R" on form P11 and succeeded by "R" on P14).

NICs must be recorded on the P11 as follows:

EXAMPLE 4

An Employee earns £515.00 a week and pays standard contracted-out NICs (COMP)

Category F NICs

Step 1. Earnings up to and including LEL

$$\left(GP - \left(\frac{LEL \times p}{w/m} \right)^* \right) =$$
$$\left(£515 - \left(\frac{£4,368 \times 1}{52} \right)^* \right) = £431 \text{ (enter weekly LEL (£84) in column 1a)}$$

If answer is negative no NICs due and no recording required. Stop.
If answer is zero or positive enter result of calculation at this point * in column 1a and proceed to Step 2.

Step 2. Earnings above LEL up to and including ET

$$\left(GP - \left(\frac{LEL \times p}{w/m} \right) \right) - \left(GP - \left(\frac{ET \times p^1}{w/m} \right)^{\#} \right) =$$
$$\left(£515 - \left(\frac{£4,368 \times 1}{52} \right) \right) - \left(£515 - \left(\frac{£5,035 \times 1}{52} \right)^{\#} \right) = £13 \text{ (enter in column 1b)}$$

[#] If answer is negative treat as zero.
If answer is zero no NICs due and no recording required in column 1b.
Stop.
If answer is positive enter in column 1b and proceed to Step 3.

Step 3. Earnings above ET up to and including UEL

$$\left(GP - \left(\frac{ET \times p^1}{w/m} \right) \right) - \left(GP - \left(\frac{UEL \times p}{w/m} \right)^{\#} \right) =$$
$$\left(£515 - \left(\frac{£5,035 \times 1}{52} \right) \right) - \left(£515 - \left(\frac{£33,540 \times 1}{52} \right)^{\#} \right) = £418 \text{ (enter in column 1c)}$$

[#] If answer is negative treat as zero.
If answer is zero no NICs due and no recording required in column 1c.
If answer is positive enter in column 1c and proceed to Step 4.

Step 4. Earnings above UEL

$$\left(GP - \left(\frac{UEL \times p}{w/m} \right) \right) =$$
$$\left(£515 - \left(\frac{£33,540 \times 1}{52} \right) \right) = £0.00$$

If answer is zero or negative no earnings above UEL. Proceed to Step 5.
If answer is positive proceed to Step 5.

Step 5. Employee's NICs

Step 3 multiplied by employee's Band C % rate (round)

$$£418 \times 9.4\% = £39.292 = £39.29$$

PLUS

Step 4 multiplied by employee's Band D % rate (round)

$$£0.00 \times 1\% = £0.00$$

$$£39.29 + £0.00 = £39.29 \text{ Employee's NICs}$$

Step 6. Employer's NICs

Step 3 multiplied by employer's Band C % rate (round)

$$£418 \times 11.8\% = £49.324 = £49.32$$

PLUS

Step 4 multiplied by employer's Band D % rate (round)

$$£0.00 \times 12.8\% = £0.00$$

$$£49.32 + £0.00 = £49.32 \text{ Employer's NICs}$$

Steps 7 Employee's NIC rebate

Step 2 multiplied by Employee's Band B % rate (round)

$$£13 \times 1.6\% = £0.208 = £0.21 \text{ Employee rebate}$$

Step 8. Employer's NIC rebate

Step 2 multiplied by employer's Band B % rate (round)

£13 x 1.0% = £0.13 Employer rebate

Step 9. Employee's net NICs

Step 5 – £39.29

MINUS

Step 7 – £0.21

= £39.08 Employee's net NICs (if result is negative enter zero in column 1e and carry forward balance to Step 10).

Step 10. Employer's net NICs

Step 6 – £49.32

MINUS

Step 8 – £0.13

= £49.19 Employer's net NICs (include any minus figure from Step 9).

Step 11. Total NICs

Step 9 – £39.08

PLUS

Step 10 – £49.19

= £88.27 Total employer and employee NICs (enter in column 1d - this could be a minus figure which should be preceded by "R" on form P11 and succeeded by "R" on P14).

NICs must be recorded on the P11 as follows:

EXAMPLE 5

An Employee was paid £460 for a 2 week period and pays reduced rate not contracted-out NICs

Category B NICs

Step 1. Earnings up to and including LEL

$$\left(GP - \left(\frac{LEL \times p}{w/m} \right)^* \right) =$$
$$\left(£460 - \left(\frac{£4,368 \times 2}{52} \right)^* \right) = £292 \text{ (enter 2 weekly LEL in column 1a)}$$

If answer is negative no NICs due and no recording required. Stop.
If answer is zero or positive enter result of calculation at this point * in column 1a and proceed to Step 2.

Step 2. Earnings above LEL up to and including ET

$$\left(GP - \left(\frac{LEL \times p}{w/m} \right) \right) - \left(GP - \left(\frac{ET \times p^1}{w/m} \right)^{\#} \right) =$$
$$\left(£460 - \left(\frac{£4,368 \times 2}{52} \right) \right) - \left(£460 - \left(\frac{£5,035 \times 2}{52} \right)^{\#} \right) = £26 \text{ (enter in column 1b)}$$

[#] If answer is negative treat as zero.
If answer is zero no NICs due and no recording required in column 1b.
Stop.
If answer is positive enter in column 1b and proceed to Step 3.

Step 3. Earnings above ET up to and including UEL

$$\left(GP - \left(\frac{ET \times p^1}{w/m} \right) \right) - \left(GP - \left(\frac{UEL \times p}{w/m} \right)^{\#} \right) =$$
$$\left(£460 - \left(\frac{£5,035 \times 2}{52} \right) \right) - \left(£460 - \left(\frac{£33,540 \times 2}{52} \right)^{\#} \right) = £266 \text{ (enter in column 1c)}$$

[#] If answer is negative treat as zero.
If answer is zero no NICs due and no recording required in column 1c.
If answer is positive enter in column 1c and proceed to Step 4.

Step 4. Earnings above UEL

$$\left(GP - \left(\frac{UEL \times p}{w/m} \right) \right) =$$
$$\left(£460 - \left(\frac{£33,540 \times 2}{52} \right) \right) = £0.00$$

If answer is zero or negative no earnings above UEL. Proceed to Step 5.
If answer is positive proceed to Step 5.

Step 5. Employee's NICs

Step 3 multiplied by employee's Band C % rate (round)

$$£266 \times 4.85\% = £12.901 = £12.90$$

PLUS

Step 4 multiplied by employee's Band D % rate (round)

$$£0.00 \times 1\% = £0.00$$

$$£12.90 + £0.00 = £12.90 \text{ Employee's NICs}$$

Step 6. Employer's NICs

Step 3 multiplied by employer's Band C % rate (round)

$$£266 \times 12.8\% = £34.048 = £34.05$$

PLUS

Step 4 multiplied by employer's Band D % rate (round)

$$£0.00 \times 12.8\% = £0.00$$

$$£34.05 + £0.00 = £34.05 \text{ Employer's NICs}$$

Steps 7 and 8 are not applicable

Step 9. Employee's net NICs

Step 5 – £12.90

MINUS

Step 7 – £0.00

= £12.90 Employee's net NICs (if result is negative enter zero in column 1e and carry forward balance to Step 10).

Step 10. Employer's net NICs

Step 6 – £34.05

MINUS

Step 8 – £0.00 (include any minus figure from Step 9).

= £34.05 Employer's net NICs

Step 11. Total NICs

Step 9 – £12.90

PLUS

Step 10 – £34.05

= £46.95 Total employer and employee NICs (enter in column 1d - this could be a minus figure which should be preceded by "R" on form P11 and succeeded by "R" on P14).

NICs must be recorded on the P11 as follows:

	1a	1b	1c	1d	1e
B	£168	£26	£266	£46.95	£12.90

EXAMPLE 6

A Director for the whole of the year earns £33,820 and pays contracted-out NICs (COSR Scheme). Has paid no NIC to date.

Category D NICs

Step 1. Earnings up to and including LEL

$$GP_{\text{ptd}} - \text{LEL} =$$

$$£33,820 - £4,368 = £29,452$$

If answer is negative no NICs due and no recording required. Stop.
If answer is zero or positive enter LEL in column 1a and proceed to Step 2.

Step 2. Earnings above LEL up to and including ET

$$(GP_{\text{ptd}} - \text{LEL}) - (GP_{\text{ptd}} - \text{ET})^{\#} =$$

$$(£33,820 - £4,368) - (£33,820 - £5,035) = £667$$

[#] If answer is negative treat as zero.
If answer is zero no NICs due and no recording required in column 1b.
If answer is positive enter in column 1b and proceed to Step 3.

Step 3. Earnings above ET up to and including UEL

$$(GP_{\text{ptd}} - \text{ET}) - (GP_{\text{ptd}} - \text{UEL})^{\#} =$$

$$(£33,820 - £5,035) - (£33,820 - £33,540) = £28,505$$

[#] If answer is negative treat as zero.
If answer is zero no NICs due and no recording required in column 1c.
If answer is positive enter in column 1c and proceed to Step 4.

Step 4. Earnings above UEL

$$GP_{\text{ptd}} - \text{UEL} =$$

$$£33,820 - £33,540 = £280$$

If answer is zero or negative no earnings above UEL treat as zero,
Proceed to Step 5.

If answer is positive proceed to Step 5.

Step 5. Director's NICs

Step 3 multiplied by employee's Band C % rate (round)

$$£28,505 \times 9.4\% = £2,679.47$$

PLUS

Step 4 multiplied by employee's Band D % rate (round)

$$£280.00 \times 1\% = £2.80$$

$$= £2,679.47 + £2.80 = £2,682.27 \text{ Employee's NIC due to date.}$$

Step 6. Director's NIC rebate

Step 2 multiplied by employee's Band B % rate (round)

$$£667 \times 1.6\% = £10.672 = £10.67$$

Step 7. Director's net NICs

Step 5 – £2,682.27

MINUS

Step 6 – £10.67

$$= £2,671.60 \text{ Employee's net NICs due to date (if result is negative enter zero in column 1e and carry forward balance to Step 10)}$$

MINUS

Employee's net NICs paid to date

$$£0.00$$

$$= £2,671.60 \text{ Employee's net NICs due this period}$$

Step 8. Employer's NICs

Step 3 multiplied by Employer's Band C % rate (round)

$$£28,505 \times 9.3\% = £2,650.965 = £2,650.96$$

PLUS

Step 4 multiplied by employer's Band D % rate (round)

$$£280 \times 12.8\% = £35.84$$

$$= £2,686.80 \text{ Employer's NICs due to date}$$

Step 9. Employer's NIC rebate

Step 2 multiplied by employer's Band B % rate (round)

$$£667 \times 3.5\% = £23.345 = £23.34$$

$$= £23.34 \text{ Employer's rebate due to date}$$

Step 10. Employer's net NICs

$$\text{Step 8} - £2,686.80$$

MINUS

$$\text{Step 9} - £23.34 \text{ (include any minus figure from Step 7)}$$

$$= £2,663.46 \text{ Employer's net NICs due to date}$$

MINUS

Employer's net NICs paid to date

$$£0.00$$

$$= £2,663.46 \text{ Employer's net NICs due this period}$$

Step 11. Total NICs

Step 7 – £2,671.60

PLUS

Step 10 – £2,663.46

= £5,335.06 Total employer and employees NICs (enter in column 1d - this could be a minus figure).

NICs must be recorded on the P11 as follows:

	1a	1b	1c	1d	1e
D	£4,368	£667	£28,505	£5,335.06	£2,671.60

EXAMPLE 7

**Director from 6th December 2006 earns £35,000 in the rest of the tax year.
Pays standard rate not contracted-out NICs.**

Pro rata Limits

LEL	£84 x 18	=	£1,512
UEL	£645 x 18	=	£11,610
ET	£5,035 ÷ 52 x 18	=	£1,743

Category A NICs

Step 1. Earnings up to and including LEL

- PK has been in use since August 2004. It is now likely to expire mid 2006 and will be followed by PL.
- SE has been in use since February 2004. It is likely to expire late 2005 and will be followed by SG.
