Why I cannot pay you SAP

I have ticked the box that applies to you.

I cannot pay you SAP. I have ticked one (or more) of the boxes below to tell you why.

You were not employed by me for long enough.

To get SAP you must have worked for me continuously for 26 weeks by the time the adoption agency tell you that you have been matched with a child for adoption.

You did not tell me soon enough that you would be away from work.

To get SAP you must give me at least 28 days notice that you will be away from work.
If you had a good reason for telling me late I may be able to accept late notice.

You did not give me acceptable evidence of your entitlement soon enough.

To get SAP you must give me acceptable evidence of your entitlement at least four weeks before you are away from work.
If you had a good reason for giving me the evidence late I may be able to accept it.

I paid you Statutory Sick Pay from DD MM YYYY

You cannot get SAP during any week that you are entitled to Statutory Sick Pay.

You were in prison or detained in legal custody on DD MM YYYY

You cannot get SAP from me if you are detained in legal custody on, or after, the first day of the SAP period.

You worked on DD MM YYYY

You cannot get SAP from me as you have used up your ten Keeping in Touch days during the Adoption Pay Period or you worked during a week of the Adoption Pay Period for a new employer.

Your earnings were too low.

To get SAP your average earnings must be at least equal to the Lower Earnings Limit. Your earnings during the relevant period, including those under any Class 1B arrangement, were insufficient for you to qualify for SAP.

Penalties

Penalties may be charged where a person, either fraudulently or negligently gives incorrect information or makes a false statement or declaration for the purpose of claiming entitlement to statutory adoption, ordinary paternity, additional paternity, maternity or sick pay.
