Introduction and key figures

The following tables show the number of families in the United Kingdom in receipt of Child Benefit (CB) at 31 August 2006, and the number of children for whom the benefit was paid. The figures are estimates based on a sample of awards, and are therefore subject to sampling error - see Appendix A.

Table 1.1 shows the trend over time of the number of families claiming CB since May 2000. At the end of August 2006 there were 7.4 million families receiving CB, with 13.2 million children for whom payments were being claimed.

The number of families at August 2006 has increased compared with August 2005. The total number of children has also increased over the same period. For children under 5, there has been an increase from 3.29 million in August 2005 to 3.35 million in August 2006.

There was also an increase in children aged 16 and over for whom CB is claimed in August 2006 compared with the previous year, from 1.71 million to 1.78 million. Part of this increase can be attributed to the new rules from April 2006 for claiming CB for young people in this age group - see Technical Note for more details.

Table 1.2 shows the numbers of families claiming CB by the size of family. In August 2006, 45% of CB families have 1 child and 39% have 2 children for whom the benefit was claimed.

A breakdown by country of residence of CB recipients is shown in **Table 1.3**. There was an increase of just under 60 thousand claimants in England in August 2006 compared with August 2005. There was also a slight increase in the number of recipients in Northern Ireland over the same period, however for Wales and Scotland there was a small drop.

Table 2 shows how the number of children in the family for whom CB is claimed varies between countries within the UK. 44% of families in England have 1 child, compared with 46% in Wales, 49% in Scotland and 41% in Northern Ireland.

In **Table 3.1**, a profile of the individual year of age of children for whom CB is claimed can be seen. There were 620 thousand children aged under 1 for whom payments were made, compared with 702 thousand for those aged 1. The number aged under 1 is particularly affected by new and revised claims that were not received and processed by the reference date but will later be backdated to before the reference date.

Chart 1 **Child Benefit recipients, by size of family**

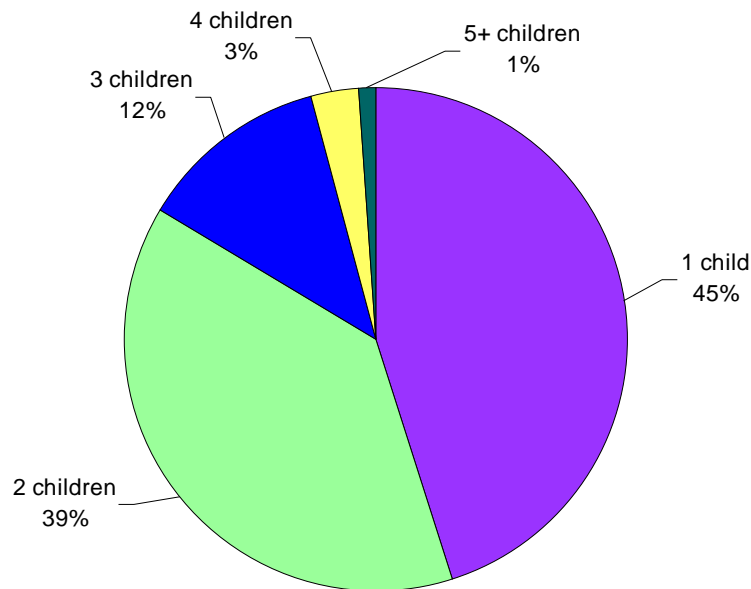


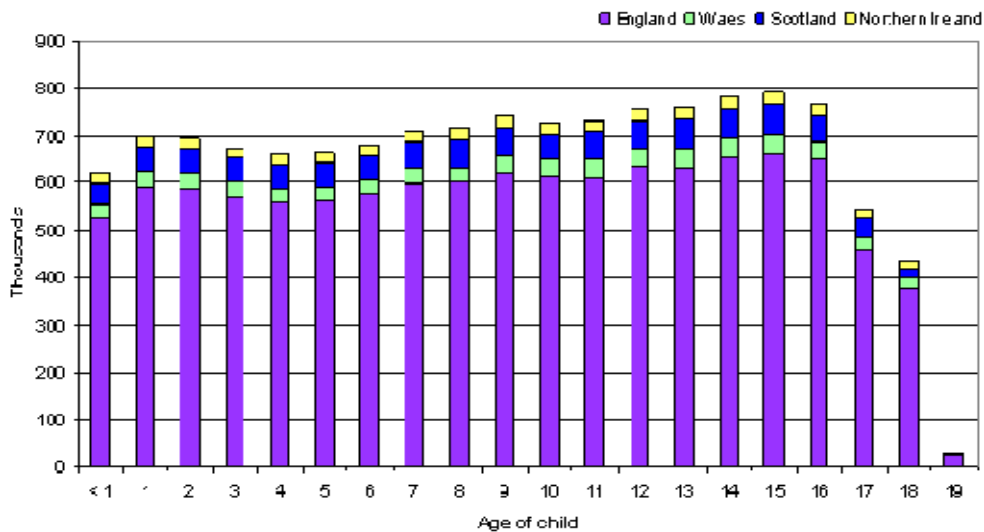

Technical note

Child Benefit

Child Benefit (CB) is paid to those responsible for children (aged under 16) or qualifying young people. The latter includes:

- a) a person under age 19 in full-time non-advanced education or (from April 2006) on certain approved vocational training programmes;
- b) a person who is aged 19 who began their course of full-time non-advanced education or approved training before reaching age 19;
(Note: those reaching 19 up to 9 April 2006 ceased to qualify on their 19th birthdays)
- c) a person who has reached age 16 until the 31 August following their 16th birthday.
- d) a person aged 16 or 17 who has left education and training who is registered with the Careers service or with Connexions and is awaiting a placement in employment or training for the limited period of up to 20 weeks from the date they left education or training.

Entitlement for a qualifying young person continues until the terminal date following the date they leave full-time education or approved training. The terminal dates are at the end of August, November, February and May (there is a slight variation for Scotland). Entitlement is also maintained for a person who is entered for external examinations connected with their course throughout the period between a person leaving education or training and completing those examinations.

Entitlement in all cases ceases when a person reaches age 20.

Awards are also subject to the claimants satisfying residence criteria.

19 Year Olds

The time series for the number of children aged over 16 in CB claims is affected by the change at (b) above. At 31 May 2006 there were 13 thousand 19 year olds for whom CB was claimed. As at 31 August 2006, this had increased to 31 thousand (See Table 3.1)

Data Quality

The numbers shown in the tables are estimates based on a random 5 per cent sample of awards current at the reference date. The extract was taken on the reference date. The figures therefore take no account of new claims, or revisions to claims, that were received or processed after the reference date, even if they are backdated to start before the reference date. Figures based on fewer than 25 cases are shown as "-".

The data extracted for each sample family include details of each child in the family for whom CB was paid at the extract date. This yields estimates of the total number of children in families receiving CB, and their characteristics.

There are around 8,800 families allocated to "Abroad". Investigations indicate that the vast majority of these are the families of armed forces or other crown servants serving overseas.

The figures are subject to sampling error - see Appendix A.

Comparison with other Statistics

There are some differences between the coverage of these quarterly statistics and the coverage of the detailed geographical statistics published for August 2005. The latter includes awards that are not current at the reference date but are made later and backdated; and the quarterly figures count of recipients includes both partners in a couple where both claim CB but only one receives the larger payment for the eldest child. After allowing for this, the number of recipients shown in the quarterly series is about 1 per cent higher than shown in the detailed publication. The main reason is that the definition of what constitutes a current award varies between the extracts used to generate the figures.

Appendix A: Sampling error

The figures in the tables are based on a random 5 per cent sample of families with claims for Child Benefit fully processed by the reference date. The sampling method ensures that the sample cases are representative of all such families on the computer system. The data for the children in these families also comprise a 5 per cent sample of children.

The figures in the tables are therefore estimates, but we know how accurate they are. For example, suppose that there are 100,000 families or children with a particular characteristic (but this number is not known), and that each is sampled with a probability of 0.2. Statistical theory says that there is a 95 per cent probability that the number sampled will lie between 19,752 and 20,248. If we were estimating the total number with the characteristic from the number in the sample, there is therefore a 95 per cent probability that our estimate will lie between 98,760 and 101,240. Approximately, we can then say that, where an estimate of 100,000 is derived from the sample, the true figure lies within 1,240 of the estimate, with a 95 per cent probability. That is, the width of the "95 per cent confidence interval" for the estimate is 1,240, or 1.2 per cent, of the estimate itself.

The width of the confidence interval varies with the size of the estimate, as shown in the table below.

Notes:

1. This was payable instead of the standard eldest child rate to most people bringing up children on their own until 6 July 1998. From that date it has continued to be payable to recipients at that date. It is also payable to lone parents who were receiving the lone parent rate of family premium in Income Support or Jobseekers' Allowance and move into work; and lone parents ceasing to receive a "specified" benefit (Child's Special Allowance for the eldest dependent child; the higher rate of Industrial Death Benefit for the child; or an increase for the eldest dependent child with either Widowed Mother's Allowance, War Widow's Pension, Retirement Pension, Industrial Disablement Pension - which includes Unemployability Supplement - or Invalid Care Allowance).
